



Year of St. Francis de Sales Inaugurated

Rev. Fr. Dr. Abraham Vettuvelil, the Superior General of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales, declared the year 2022 – 23 as 'Year of St Francis de Sales' for the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales and the Fransalian Associates on April 21, 2022, through a video message online.

He had announced the year as "Year of St Francis de Sales" for the Congregation and the Fransalian Associates through his circular dated April 16, 2022, starting from Divine Mercy Sunday on April 24, 2022 and concluding on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 16, 2023.

"The year – 2022 – is a significant year for the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales and the Fransalian Associates. We are celebrating the 400th death anniversary of our spiritual master and patron... This year, we will study St Francis de Sales, imitate his virtues and use his method of pastoral care with compassion and gentleness towards sinners...," said Fr. Vettuvelil, declaring the Year of St Francis de Sales 2022 – 23 opened.

The General Administration has constituted an ad hoc committee with members from the provinces and administrative units to organize, facilitate, implement and monitor the programs in the year of St Francis de Sales.

Following the Superior General's declaration, different Provinces and the Vice Province of the Congregation inaugurated the 'Year of St Francis de Sales' in their own way on April 24, the Divine Mercy Sunday.

Most Rev John Moolachira, Archbishop, Archdiocese of Guwahati, Assam

'Being More Missionary and Pastorally Oriented'

The MSFS works in the Archdiocese of Guwahati, Assam, since its inception and Most Rev John Moolachira, the Archbishop of Guwahati, knows the MSFS ever since their arrival in Northeast India in 1975. The Archbishop shared his impressions on the MSFS with Fr Vintu Augustine, editor-in-chief of Fransalian International, over the email. Here are the excerpts;

What are your impressions and experience with the mission and life of MSFS?

The MSFS lives humble lives and readily mixes with priests, religious and people. Like any other priests or religious they are engaged in ministries such as pastoral work, education, social service, preaching retreats, formation programmes, etc.

They are respectful and obedient to the hierarchy of the Church. Many of them are academically highly qualified in different areas and use their knowledge for the good of the Church. The provincials were always ready to assist the archdiocese when it needed personnel badly and sometimes at short notice. And they were gracious enough to withdraw quietly when the diocese had its own personnel to manage the parish or institutions.

How do you assess the contribution of the MSFS to the Church and society?

MSFS came to Northeast India to help in missionary activities. Initially, they were assisting in parish ministry and later on they were given parishes to run on their own. I know that they are working in distant and almost unapproachable areas in Arunachal Pradesh and are working in backward regions of the African



continent. They have also turned out to be good educationalists and run schools and institutions well.

We have the MSFS running St Clement Philosophical College for the dioceses of Assam, Morning Star College at Barrackpore for the Bengal Regional Bishop's Conference, CBCI College of Medical Education at Ranchi, etc. They are totally committed to their responsibilities.

Do you recall any particular experience with MSFS that has made an impact on the lives of people?

I can think of the contribution of the MSFS in rendering service to a large number of poor people especially around Guwahati through FAsCE India during Covid times and flood. Many of the victims would have been starving if not for their help.

The service of the MSFS at St Clement College in the archdiocese of Guwahati, developing it into a premier philosophate, is a great and generous achievement. They are good formators of youngsters at that stage of formation. The College has good reputation for the

quality and knowledge of its students.

What is your message to the MSFS especially the younger ones?

I would want them to be more missionary and pastorally oriented. Reach out to people, tribes and communities that are or will be open to Catholic faith; work with their existing communities to launch out to others who have not yet known Christ. Every MSFS should prove that he is indeed a missionary. The leadership should recognize and honour pastors more than the scholars to prove that they are really "Missionaries" of St Francis de Sales.

I am grateful to God for the gift of my association with the MSFS fathers through which I have been able to grow in many ways and am able to live a happy and contended life.

INSIGHTS FROM THE PATRON

Getting Rooted in Little Virtues

The importance and relevance of Community for a happy and meaningful life is acknowledged by people of all walks of life.

St Francis de Sales gave a list of virtues that he called 'little virtues', which grow beneath the foot of the Cross watered with the blood of the Son of God. The list includes; humility, patience, gentleness, kindness, forbearance, calmness, good temper, heartiness, forgiveness, simplicity, frankness and the like. "Such virtues are like violets growing in a shady nook, fed by the dew of Heaven, and shedding forth a sweet and precious odour." (The Spirit of St. Francis de Sales, By Jean Pierre Camus)

To the question, what else can we find on the top of the Cross? he replied "Plenty" and went on to explain; "There you will find bright, shining graces — such as prudence, justice, magnificence, zeal, liberality, almsgiving, strength, charity, bodily mortification, obedience, contemplation, constancy, contempt of riches and honours, and the like." He further added: "Men are keen after such virtues because they win esteem and praise; but in truth we ought only to value them in so far as we can please God by their means, and find fresh ways of

proving our love for Him therein." (Ibid, 58-59). From the above, it is easy to understand the true nature of community life, in the vision of SFS who was himself the founder of the congregation of the Sisters of the Visitation. "Little things done in a spirit of fervent love are infinitely more precious than much greater works done with less love," said St Francis de Sales. "I know that little troubles are often more vexatious than greater matters, because of their multiplicity and their importunate pressure just as home trials are harder to bear than such as some from without; but I know this too, that victory over these is often more acceptable to God than many things which seem more important to the world's sight." I shall end with yet another quote from Francis, "Most assuredly, loving we obey as in obeying we love; but if such obedience is excellent and amiable, it is because it tends to love, and its perfection depends rather upon the fact that while obeying we love, than because loving we obey."

In the light of this enlightening and challenging understanding of 'community', let's assess the quality of our communities and take necessary steps to improve the same.

Effective Ways of Community Life

THOUGHTS FROM THE FOUNDER'S HEART

Holy Trinity is a communion of self-emptying. The Church is a mirror of that communion. A religious Community lives that through the mystique of living together.

Servant of God, Fr. Mermier loved to live in the community. At La Roche, the first community, "there reigned between members sincere cordiality, simplicity and modesty cementing their unity. Their spirit of zeal animated their activities and they shared all their experiences, in the art of preaching and in being all to all. They made their meditation together, as well as their examen and spiritual reading. Every Friday they attended a conference given by Fr. Mermier..." (Jean Rey, p.38). The recreations took place in good kindlier spirit, they all played, including Fr. Mermier, marbles, had recreations in the garden, went for long walks, refreshed and relaxed before setting off to missions. "Fr. Mermier was most austere of them all and yet cheerful. He put everyone at ease. Strict with himself, he was most accommodating towards others." (Duval, p. 52). He was the rock of that community, as said by Fr. Gaiddon, and its soul. He exhorted his confreres in effective ways of living in a community. First, he insisted that we esteem our Vocation and work seriously, carefully, constantly on our own sanctification for it is the will of God (Letters, No. 132, p. 211). He also emphasised that we bind ourselves to the Congregation, loving and esteeming it as our unique treasure. (Ibid No. 219, p. 135).

The guiding philosophy of Community life is the Rule (The Constitutions). It is the key to paradise, now and later (Ibid.), and hence everyone without any exception is to be faithful and follow it in letter and spirit. Then the Confreres are to be animated by a sense of belongingness. (Letters 233, p. 142). Physical health and wellness are of paramount importance. So, he suggested 'more health than less' (Letter 271, p.164) and seven hours of sleep (Letter 233).

They are to be charitable, never saying harsh words but be gentle and reasonable, esteem, respect, love, assist in mutual love, oblige, bear with one another. (Counsels given on 19.6.1848). They are to have warm and cordial regard, appreciate and support each other (Letter 223, p.137).

Listen respectfully and never minimize the other's feelings. Be generous with smiles and restrained in anger! Negativity like criticism, gossip, envy, jealousy, hostility have no place; Community life needs a big joyful heart and smiling face! Such a community becomes a place of growth and energizes for the mission and a witness to the Gospel!




